THE AUTUMN **VEGIE PATCH**

Time to rejuvenate your veggie patch?

HERBS - chives, coriander, garlic, mint, oregano, parsley, rosemary, shallots, tarragon and thyme.

FRUIT & VEGETABLE - broad bean, kale, beetroot, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, spinach,

leek, lettuce, onion, potatoes, silver beet.

Tip: Be careful for slugs and snails at this time of the year, get into the habit of watering in the morning to avoid leaving plants wet throughout the night when these guys are active.

DID YOU KNOW THAT MANY OF THE OPEN SPACES **AROUND WARRALILY ARE IN THEIR FIRST STAGES** OF A VERY IMPORTANT REVEGETATION PROCESS?

You may have noticed some areas around Warralily where there are large patches of sparse soil.

This is most likely an area that is undergoing essential preparation stages for revegetation, you can see an example of this along Stewarts Road Greenway. Before planting the native grasses and plants we first need to rid the soil of weeds. Weed control is the most significant site preparation work and takes time. During this time we are encouraging the weeds to grow and then spraying them on a regular basis to deplete their seed content in the soil. This will reduce or remove competition for water, nutrients and light from establishing plants, seedlings or grasses. Planting usually takes place in the wetter months and we hope to start this in April/ May this year. The effectiveness of weed control prior to planting and for at least the first 12 months after planting often determines the success or failure of a revegetation project.

Development Update

The Summer months have brought some significant turning points Armstrong Creek. The opening of The Village Shopping Centre has brought great strength to the community as has the opening of Armstrong Creek School, between them creating over 160 local jobs. Now with approximately 6,500 residents living in Warralily there's a buzz in the air and what's more exciting is we are seeing new additions commencing everyday. Here's a snapshot of what's going on around us:

Sports Pavillion- Central **Boulevard opposite** Armstrong Creek School

Funded by the City of Greater Geelong (\$3.18m) & Victorian Government (\$500,000), the pavilion will include social room field and 1 multipurpose oval), with a kitchen and bar, four change rooms, umpire's room, meeting spaces and association lighting, carparking and administration facilities.

proposed new sports clubs

It is anticipated that the sports facilities and pavillion will be

completed by Jan / Feb 2019 and will be the future home to

Sports Facilities – adjoining the Sports Pavillion

Warralily have commenced works on the \$4m sports facilities which will include 2 sports ovals (1 dedicated AFL cricket nets and outdoor netball courts. This will also provide surrounding informal landscape areas, open space areas with connecting shared paths and a playground.

Armstrong Creek Town Centre - on the eastern side of Torquay Road between Boundary and Burvilles Road.

This project is currently under planning permit stage. The Grange was officially of February with 50 lots selling on that weekend. The precinct over time will develop into around 900 titled lots, including a future p-6 state school, ovals, parks and additional creek interface opportunities.

Bluebird Early Education Centre - Warralily Blvd. iust this side of Horseshoe

Construction commenced around 4 weeks ago Shared footpath trail along launched to the public on the 24th Stewarts Rd greenway. Plans are currently being finalised, with concrete being poured from August 2018.

PET EDUCATION a letter from the COGG

In accordance with Council's Dogs in Public Places Policy, our purpose is to guide the community and set rules, which primarily aim to ensure community safety, environment protection and fair and equitable access to such spaces.

In acknowledging the many social and wellbeing benefits of pet ownership, we support this being done on a manner that complies with the above mentioned principles. More specifically within the Policy it is stated that; 'Within the City of Greater Geelong, unless otherwise designated by signage, all public open space areas shall be designated as 'On-Leash Controlled Areas' (public open space areas includes roads, footpaths, beaches, reserves, parks, play grounds and other council lands and buildings). Furthermore, dogs are prohibited from any area designated as a conservation zone.

What does this mean for the Warrilily Estate and its community? As it stands;

- All open public spaces are 'On-Leash-Controlled Areas'; and With respect to domestic cats, there is an order in place whereby within the City of Greater Geelong, cats are required to be contained within their property at all times and secured in a confined space between sunset and sunrise.

It is anticipated that by April 2018, we will commence the review process for the

Dogs in Public Places Policy, which will include an extensive community consultation process that aims to ensure that any future policy position is in line with the community's expectations. During this process, there will be opportunity to possibly identify some open space areas that may be suitable as 'Off-Leash Supervised Areas' that do not conflict with the purpose of the Policy. Over the next 4-6 weeks, we will be assessing the estate with the asset managers to identify suitable locations for the relevant signage to designate the 'On-Leash Controlled Area' requirements.
