4.9 KM SHARED PATH NOW CONNECTS BARWON HEADS TO SURF COAST HWY

DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The winter months haven't held this award winning developer back from delivering some of Warralily's most important community outdoor activity spaces to date. With more than 82 stages delivered, 2,788 lots settled and 380 lots currently under construction our 7,500 strong community continues to prosper.





Walking or cycling from Barwon Heads Rd through to the Surf Coast Highway is now seamless with the recent completion of the Stewarts Reserve section of the shared pathway. Nearly \$2 million has been invested by Warralily in a 4.9 km path network that connects open spaces, playgrounds and the creek corridor to homes, schools, community facilities, sports ovals and shopping precincts.

The opening of the new Warralily Sports Precinct on Central Boulevard was celebrated with the first home matches of local AFL and Soccer Clubs, this space is already proving to be an important physical and social infrastructure for our growing community.

Civil works of Stage 1 and 2 at The Grange are nearing completion as we prepare for the final layer of rock and asphalt to be laid. As the project progresses landscaping will commence and is scheduled to be completed in line with residents moving into their new homes. Head up to the viewing platform off Williams Road and see for yourself, future stages are already taking shape with lamp posts in place lining the roads and pathways. Further improvements to Whites Rd will include the removal of overhead power lines making way for a wider road.

Civil works for the Axis townhouses are now complete! The 4 bedroom townhouses on Carter Road are in walking distance to supermarkets, schools and parks.

It was decided that a dog signage audit needed to be conducted across the City to ensure that all signage is correct, clear, legible, and highly visible in order to support our residents to do the right thing when it comes to controlling dogs and providing safe, shared spaces for all to enjoy.

A short online survey will be opening for community feedback on the dog control order changes proposed by Barwon Coast Committee of Management Inc. (BCCM) which will affect the coastline running between Breamlea and Collendina.

This consultation aims to ensure that these proposed changes are acceptable to residents within the City of Greater Geelong, and if so, the City will adopt the orders.

In July this year, the City of Greater Geelong provided a discount cat desexing service in hopes to reduce the number of cats that are uncontrollably breeding in our community; which leads to the large number of stray and feral cats in our area, as well as trying to lighten the burden of unwanted cats

that are surrendered to Geelong Animal Welfare Society (GAWS). This program saw the price of desexing drop to \$99 and \$130 per male and female cat respectively, and these feline patients also received free microchipping, council registration, deflea and deworm treatment and a pet food voucher.

This year's campaign saw 395 cats desexed, which was a 12% jump on the number of cats treated over the last 4 years.
